ART GALLERY OF ALBERTA 50% off Admission

The Art Gallery of Alberta (AGA), originally called the Edmonton Museum of Arts and later the Edmonton Art Gallery, opened in 1924 and occupied several properties, including the Hotel Macdonald, until its current location on Churchill Square, in 1969. In 2005, the gallery was renamed the Art Gallery of Alberta to better reflect and welcome the entire province. In 2010, our current building, now one of the most renowned and well-liked in Edmonton, opened to the public. The redeveloped building features four floors of exhibition and event space, an education and learning vent space, and an education and learning centre, offering programs, camps, and classes for all ages.

The Art Gallery of Alberta's permanent collection includes over 6,000 local, Canadian, and international works, with a focus on art produced in Alberta and other parts of Canada. In addition to exhibiting its permanent collection, the AGA also hosts travelling exhibitions from around the country, and the world.

The 48-second ride leads you to a promenade partway down the hill where you can have a picnic, snap pictures, or read a book. Walk across the promenade to the lookout point with an unobstructed view of the river valley.

EDMONTON OIL KINGS (ICE HOCKEY) Affordable Visit

The Edmonton Oil Kings are a major junior hockey team based in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada. They are one of 22-member teams of the Western Hockey



League (WHL) and, subsequently, one of 60 teams that comprise the Canadian Hockey League (CHL).

Since 2007-08, the Oil Kings have seen 23 players selected at the NHL Draft; 11 of those players chosen in the first two rounds. As of the 2021-22 campaign, they have graduated 15 players who have gone on to play in the National Hockey League.

Ticket prices range from approximately \$40 to \$80 per person.

MUTTART CONSERVATORY 10% off Admission

The Muttart Conservatory is a unique botanic display garden that brings together a collection of plants from a diverse range of climatic conditions. The structure was designed in the early 1970s by Edmonton architect Peter Hemingway. His plan was to combine the practical requirement for plant height with a striking visual effect. The pyramid shape is static and non-directional, providing stark contrast to its natural setting in the River Valley and the softness of the living world within. The Conservatory features four display pyramids and a small skylight located over the Centre Court area. Each Pyramid maintains unique environmental conditions to meet the needs of the plants housed within.

NEON SIGN MUSEUM Free

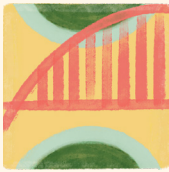


Food and Entertainment

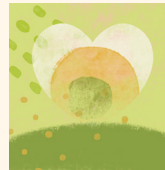
